Cambodian names are reversed - The family name comes first and the given name is second. For example, my name would be written Wagner Bhavia.

Birthdays are a new phenomenon – Traditionally, everyone turned one year older on the Khmer New Year in mid-April and most people didn't know their birthdate. City dwellers are becoming more westernized but birthdays are still not celebrated in the rural areas.

Rice for every meal – If you haven't eaten rice, you haven't had a meal in Cambodia.

Holidays – Major holidays in Cambodia are celebrated by taking food to the monks in the Buddhist temples.
